MESSAGE FROM OUR HEAD OF SCHOOL

Dear Bishop McGuinness Families -

Earlier this week, we commemorated the life, work, and death of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. The annual holiday should remind us of the sacrifice inherent in living out the Gospel and the need for individuals and communities in every generation to continue to be Christ-like and bring Christ to a world in need of peace, love, and justice.



As Christians, we are guided to form our conscience on a fundamental belief that each of us is formed in the image and likeness of our loving Creator. The Church teaches us that "all men are endowed with a rational soul and are created in God's image; they have the same nature and origin and, being redeemed by Christ, they enjoy the same divine calling and destiny." This inherent dignity bestowed upon each human soul, Saint John Paul II describes as an "... altogether special brotherhood and as a basis of the rights and duties of the human person. Hence every form of discrimination ... is absolutely unacceptable."

We humbly accept that throughout human history we, as individuals and as a people, have failed to live out perfectly our mission to love one another as Christ has loved us, in ways that range from the small and seemingly insignificant to the serious and deeply tragic. Help us to appreciate the great gift that is human life formed in your image, a reflection of your holiness.

Help us to recognize you in all whom you have created: children not yet born, families affected by poverty and war, people of different abilities, people from other lands, and all who are victims of hatred and racism.

Help us to bear witness to the dignity of all whom you have created, regardless of stage of life, or wealth, or ability, or color, or creed, for every person is fully equal in your loving eyes.

Share with us your holy knowledge that we are all your children, each bestowed with inherent dignity.











Seminar students teaching Science lessons at IHM!



Driver Eligibility Information

When your student is ready to go to the DMV to get his/her permit, a parent will need to call The School Office to request an official transcript and Driver Eligibility Certificate.

Please allow 48 hours notice to process any transcript requests.

A parent must bring the student's Driver's Ed Completion Certificate to The School Office and sign the Driver Eligibility Certificate. The Driver Eligibility Form is good for 30 daysonce it has been signed. Please keep this in mind when making plans to go to the DMV.

The DMV is now requiring official transcripts as a proof of residency. Please contact the front office at 336-564-1010 to make this request.

Driver's Ed is offered through the NC Driving School. You can visit www.ncdrivingschool.com for instructions to sign up. North Carolina requires that Driver's Ed be taken in the county of the high school. (i.e. Bishop McGuinness is in Forsyth county. If you live in Guilford county, you must take Driver's Ed in Forsyth county.) You can sign up on their website at one of the public high schools. You may choose to do private Driver's Ed, which may be completed in any county.
