The Opportunity Scholarship program has undergone recent changes that will expand the access to scholarship funds to more families for the 2024-2025 school year. Due to these changes, all families applying for tuition assistance through Bishop McGuinness will be required to first apply for the Opportunity Scholarship. Tuition assistance will only be awarded after we have received notice of scholarship award amounts and any other assistance awarded from third parties.



COUNSELING CENTER

ATTENTION JUNIORS:

You will be sitting for the ACT with the rest of your class on **Tuesday**, **March 12th**. This is the full ACT exam and results can be used for college admissions. Juniors are asked to report to your homerooms by 8:30am. The standard time exam will conclude around 1:00pm and



students will be released at that time. Students with accommodations will be told beforehand where they will be testing and may be dismissed at a later time. We encourage you to rest, eat a healthy breakfast and report to school with number 2 pencils and a fully charged calculator.

2024 AP EXAM SCHEDULE

Driver Eligibility Information

When your student is ready to go to the DMV to get his/her permit, a **parent will need to** call The School Office to request an official transcript and Driver Eligibility Certificate.

Please allow 48 hours notice to process any transcript requests.

A parent must bring the student's Driver's Ed Completion Certificate to The School Office and sign the Driver Eligibility Certificate. The Driver Eligibility Form is good for 30 daysonce it has been signed. Please keep this in mind when making plans to go to the DMV.

The DMV is now requiring official transcripts as a proof of residency. Please contact the front office at 336-564-1010 to make this request.

Driver's Ed is offered through the NC Driving School. You can visit www.ncdrivingschool.com for instructions to sign up. North Carolina requires that Driver's Ed be taken in the county of the high school. (i.e. Bishop McGuinness is in Forsyth county. If you live in Guilford county, you must take Driver's Ed in Forsyth county.) You can sign up on their website at one of the public high schools. You may choose to do private Driver's Ed, which may be completed in any county.
